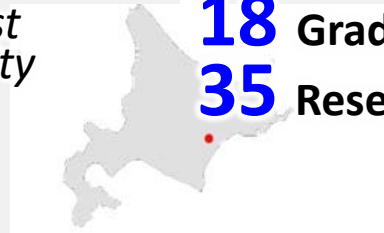

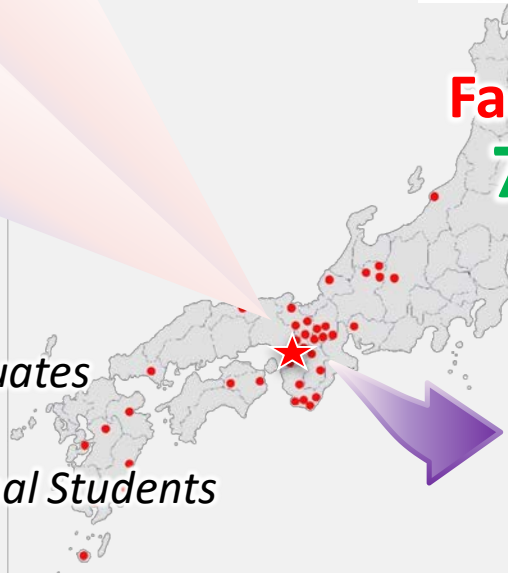

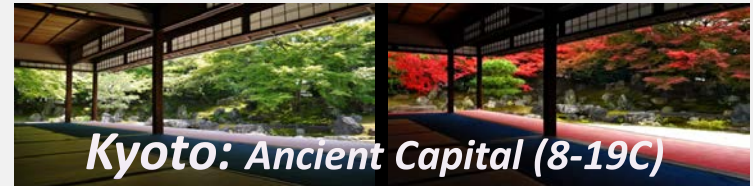

- Short-term scholarship programs
 - ex. **The Amgen Scholars Japan Program 2019 (11 June - 4 August)**
(Round-trip airfare, accommodation, health insurance are paid. 180,000 yen is provided.)

- 8 weeks (June 11 to August 5 for 2019)
- Travel costs, a scholarship of ¥ 180,000 (€1,404*), accommodation etc.

● Short-term Special Courses

- Offered by some of the faculties and graduate schools
- 3 months maximum (may be extended)
- Tuition fee is ¥ 29,700 (€232*) per month

● Research Students (*Kenkyusei*)

- Non-degree-seeking Research Students

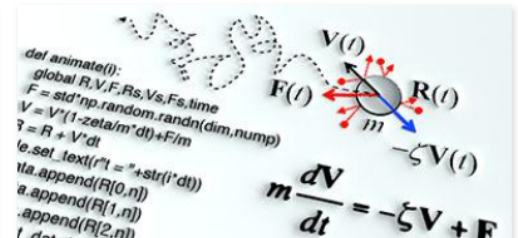
